## **President's Message**

Welcome to 2024! I hope that each of you had a wonderful holiday. It has been a pleasure to serve as your president. My term has had many challenges, but I am proud of all your 2023 Board has accomplished.

My theme was "This is not your mama's quilt association," which has proven true. Your board met monthly and diligently worked to provide more for you, our members. MQA held the Summer Gathering at a location where members could stay and attend classes - all under one roof - making the experience more comfortable.

MQA returned to the southern portion of our state for the first time in many years. The first MQA Quilt Shop Hop was held in the Biloxi area in conjunction with the Fall Gathering. MQA's first advertising plan was developed under the leadership of President-elect Lynn Blaylock. The Fall Gathering had three event sponsors.

The MQA Documentation Money Market Account was earning little revenue. After diligently researching the account's history, MQA had an opportunity to purchase a \$20,000 CD that earns 5% for eight months. The Documentation account was less than \$20,000, so funds from the General Account were added to make up the difference. This action will net MQA \$700+. At the end of the eight months, we can purchase another CD and roll the interest into the CD or add the interest to the General Fund. This action puts MQA in a more favorable position for the future.

The Board recognized the need to collect all MQA records in one place with backup. The Records Management position was identified, the record-keeping process was formulated, and the qualifications of the person needed for the job were identified. MQA called for candidates for this position, and I am happy to announce we have a volunteer who will be introduced at the Spring Gathering. As this will be an ongoing position for MQA, a vote will be held at the Gathering to add this voting position to the MQA board.

MQA is adding a membership app to the website. The app will handle membership renewals, event registration, and other functions yet to be determined. The app will streamline the process of renewals and registrations with more accuracy, less effort, and more security. Your membership will always be up-to-date. On the administration side, the app allows for easier management, money transfer, and accounting records. Does this mean those who don't use a computer and still receive their newsletter by US Mail will be left behind? No! We have a plan to help you. There will be more information forthcoming shortly, so stay tuned!

I have enjoyed being your president. Thank you for this opportunity to serve. The best part has been getting to know more of you throughout the year.

I look forward to seeing you soon.
